Description

This mound forming perennial is typically seen in higher elevations in the Intermountain area. The lavender colored flowers are very attractive to insects and emit a strong mint aroma.

| • Native habitat | Typically in higher elevation, rocky areas |
| • Soil | Dry, rocky, well drained soils. |
| • Cold Tolerance | Zones 4 - 8 |
| • Drought Tolerance | Medium, water one time per month in most landscapes |
| • Salt Tolerance | ? |
| • Sun/Shade Preference | full sun |
| • Propagation | seed |
| • Maintenance | Requires good drainage, Deadhead spent flowers for appearance and extend/secondary bloom |
